Today I am talking to one of our Curriculum Leaders to find out all about the Glenwood Curriculum for All.

When you say Curriculum for All who does the All refer to?

Well, it's everybody – from the site staff, to kitchen team, LSA's, teaching staff and of course our fabulous young people and their families.

Okay so how did the Curriculum for All come about?

As part of our discussions about finding each young person's path we discovered that there were many common threads that are featured in each bespoke curriculum. This led to us making decisions about what we want our young people to learn and develop and this is what we have decided to call our Curriculum Intentions.

So what are the Curriculum Intentions?

There are 11 which are in no particular order as no one intention is more important than the others.

Can you give me an example of how a Curriculum Intention can be achieved by all?

Okay – if I take the Intention of being brave: for example for a learner this could mean trying a new experience; for a leader in the school, this could be about opening up our classrooms to share new initiatives; for our families this could be about working with The Glen residential and school to create a 24hr curriculum.
